- **In-person Summerscapes registration begins on March 29, 2024.**
 - Visit the Records and Registration window in the Neill Currie Continuing Education Building at 218 Hull Road.
 - Cash, in-state checks, money orders, Visa, Mastercard, and Discover are accepted.
 - Typical registration hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 am–4:45 pm. **Note:** FTCC may follow a special summer schedule from mid-May through July. In this case, the window will be open from 7:30 am-4:45 pm Monday-Thursday and 7:30 am-1:15 pm on Fridays.
 - You will complete a registration form for each class that a student is taking.
 - You will complete a parental consent/emergency contact once per summer for each student.
